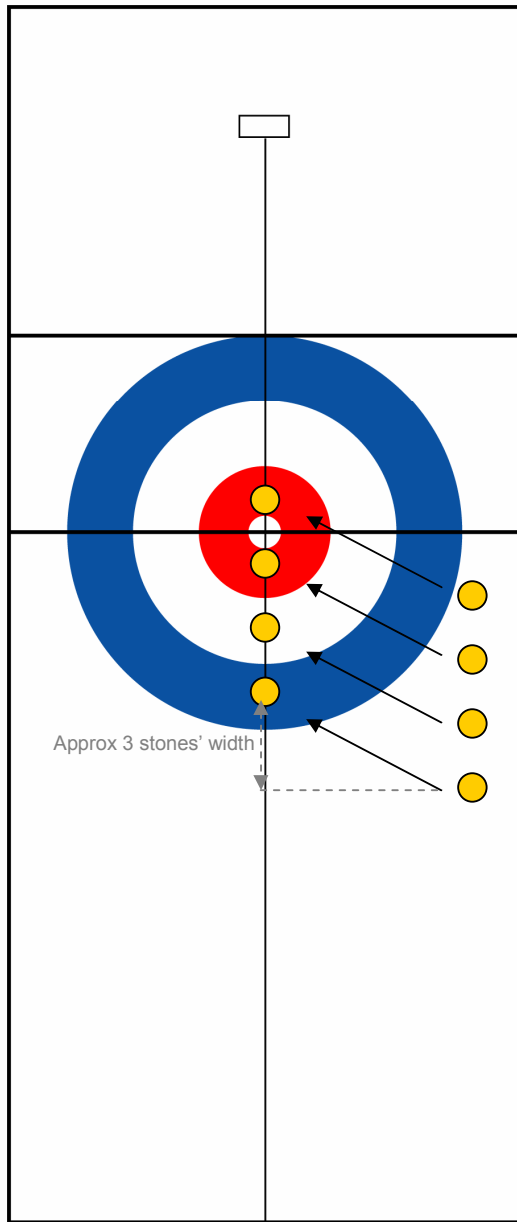

Objective

Stone redirection.

One aspect of the game that has changed is the ability to use stones that end up near the side boards in the free guard zone, to re-direct stones into the house to remove an opposition stone and score "the big end". Wayne Middaugh's and Sandra Schmirler's turned this into an art form. Here is a drill which will go a long into putting this weapon into a team's arsenal.

Stones are positioned in the house (number and exact position at your discretion, the diagram configuration is just a sample). Stones are then placed near the side in the free guard zone. These are the stones that will redirect the played stones into the house to "pick off" the "hombres".

Be sure to position the re-redirect stones on both sides of the sheet.

Scoring

One point awarded for each hit & roll

One point for every placed stone removed from play.

Placed stones remaining in the house are deducted from total.
