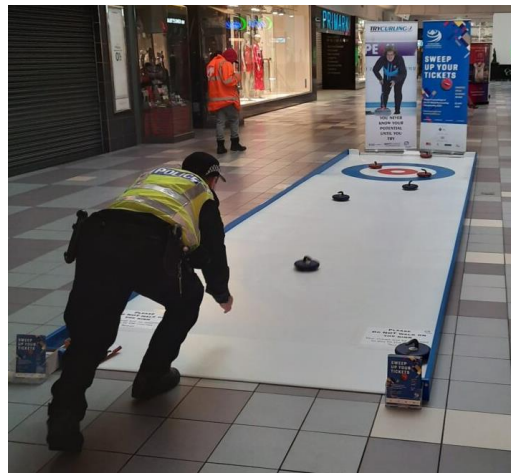
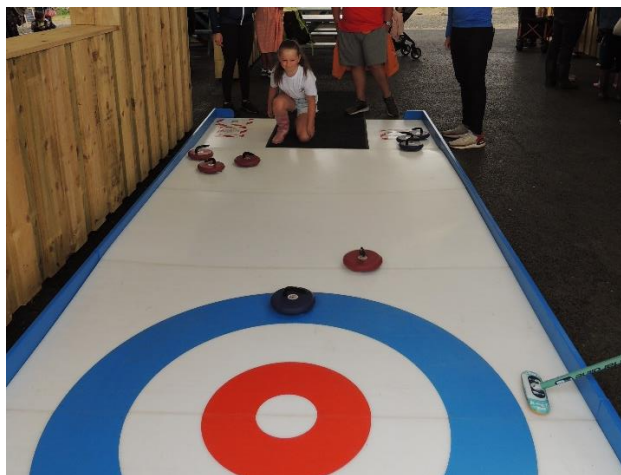


Street Rink Information



The Street Rink is a total of 8m long and 2m wide, however can be shortened by using less pieces. It is ideal for community events where the desire is to attract attention and provide members of the public with the opportunity to try street curling.

Street Curling

Street Curling can be seen as a sport in itself! Developed in Canada to bring curling out of ice rinks and is now used in countries around the world in a variety of places including, festivals, corporate events and more.

Scottish Curling's Street Rink

The Street Rink is available to member ice rinks, groups and clubs to use for development initiatives. The rink can be collected from our store in Ingliston Showground, Edinburgh (EH28) and used for free to engage potential members and groups.

How to rent the Street Rink?

Those interested in using the Street Rink should contact their Development Manager or complete the booking enquiry form found [here](#). Scottish Curling will then check the availability of the Street Rink and confirm the booking dates with the hirer. Once confirmed the following will need to be completed and returned to Scottish Curling prior to collection of the rink:

- Disclaimer
- Risk Assessment

Transportation of the Street Rink from Ingliston is the responsibility of the hirer, including the arrangement of suitable transport.

The Street Rink can be collected and returned Monday – Friday between 9am – 5pm. If another time is required, this can be requested, however may not always be possible.

What does the Street Rink include?

Included with the hire is:

- Components to construct the Street Rink
- Toolbox with tools required for construction
- Promotional materials including Scottish Curling balloons
- “Do Not Stand on the Rink” signs to attach to the rink

Street Rink Components

- 7x 1 metre long by 2 metres wide sheets
- 2x ½ metre long by 2 metres wide sheets
- 4 x small corner side boards
- 8 x sloped side boards
- 8 x side boards
- 2 metre long black pole
- Small black hammering block
- 8 stones (Stored in Purple Bag)
- Box of Plastic joining rods

Toolbox Contents

- Claw Hammer
- Mallet Hammer
- Chisel
- Allan Keys
- Plastic Bag with dowels
- Plastic Bag with 4 Screws and the Allan Key that fits
- 2 pairs of gloves

Constructions Tips

- If possible, lay out all of the parts of the rink before starting, so they are easy to access, and you can gauge the space required.
- The rink takes a bit of muscle and perseverance to get plastic rods through which connect the big white sheets together. Use other rods and a mallet to knock them through.
- Sometimes the corners of the big sheets get bent so use the chisel to bend them back into place. You need to do that in order to get rods through.

FAQs

Can the Street Rink be used outside?

Yes, however it should not be used in wet weather.

How many people does it take to build the Street Rink?

Four people can construct the rink in around 60 minutes. Dismantling the rink can be done in around 15 minutes.

Can the Street Rink be moved once built?

No, it is not possible to move the rink when built, so take care to ensure that it is constructed in the correct location.

Can people stand on the Street Rink?

No, members of the public should not stand on the rink. Should it be necessary to retrieve a stone out of reach, a member of rink staff should do so without standing on the rink.

Are there COVID protocols for the Street Rink?

There are no COVID protocols required to be in place, however judgement should be used. Providing hand sanitizer for users, and wiping down the stones regularly will help to prevent the spread of COVID.
