INTRODUCTION

Scottish Curling aims to provide line scoring for all competitions using its own bespoke line scoring system. The line scoring system is integrated into the Scottish Curling website and sits separately with its own log in for users to access and manage. Amendments and updates made in the system to competition pages are automatically viewable on the Scottish Curling website once published.

Competition scores and results are one of the most popular visited areas of the website and this reporting is a key part of the Scottish Curling events coverage and communications.

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Note: Please note when using the line scoring system, do not have more than one tab of the competitions line scoring system open at the time as this can be confusing and cause loss of data.

1. LOGGING IN

There are two ways to log into the competitions website in order to begin line scoring. The first is to type the following into the address bar:

competitions.scottishcurling.org/wp-admin for the live site.

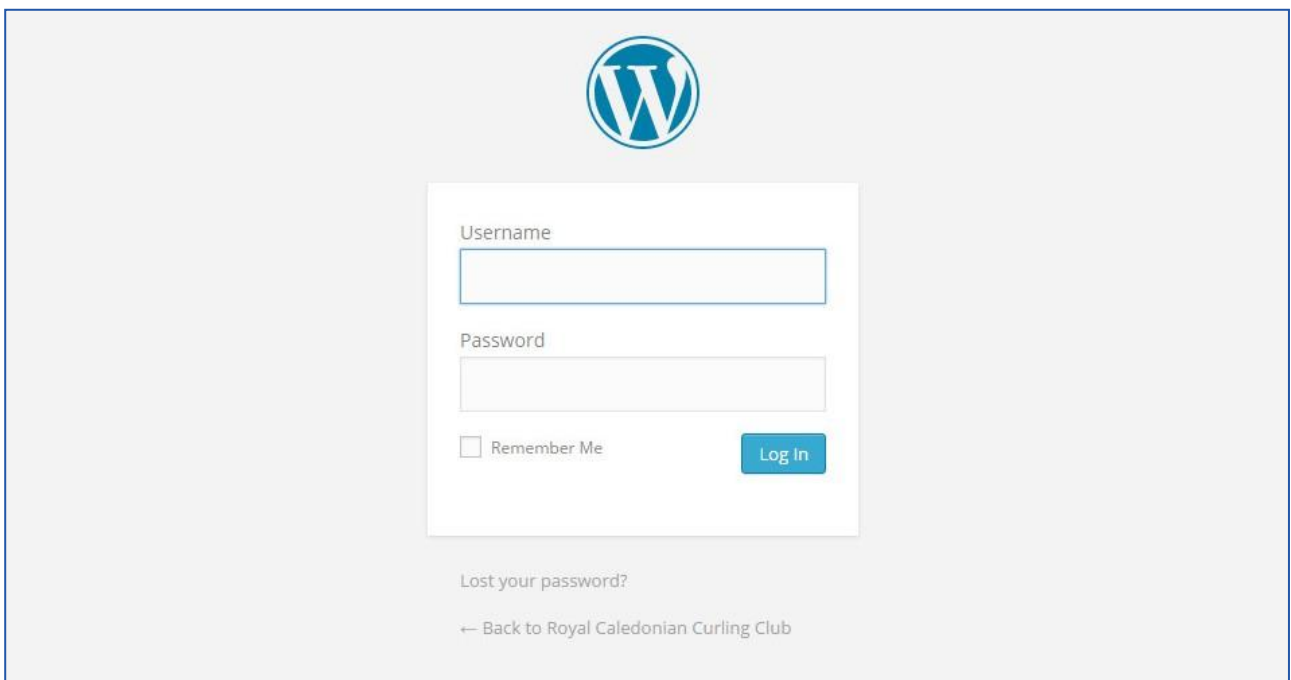
Alternatively, you can go to the Scottish Curling website at www.Scottishcurling.org.

Once there, click on the “Competitions tab” located at the top of the page. Once you have done this type **/wp-admin** at the end of the address as shown below.



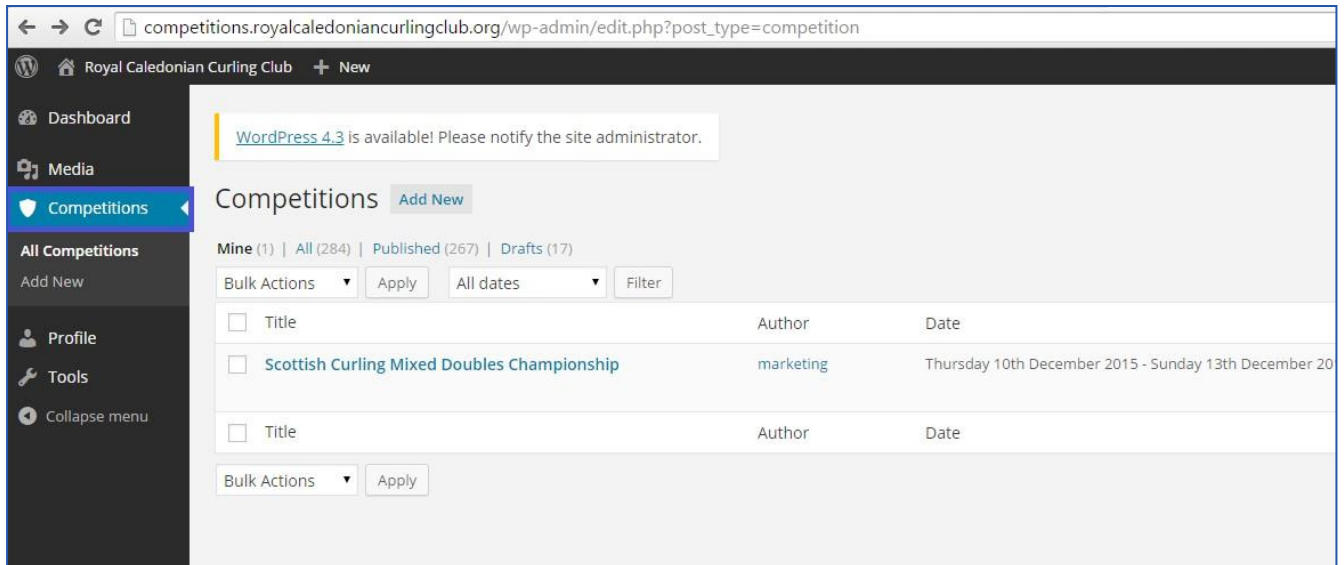
Once you have entered the above address in the address bar you will be redirected to the login page for the Scottish Curling Competitions website, as shown below.

Now simply type in the username and password which you have been supplied with.

2. LOCATING COMPETITION

When you have signed in, you now want to locate the competition which you are scoring. To enter the editing page for the competition you are scoring, click on the competitions tab located on the left of your screen as highlighted in blue below.

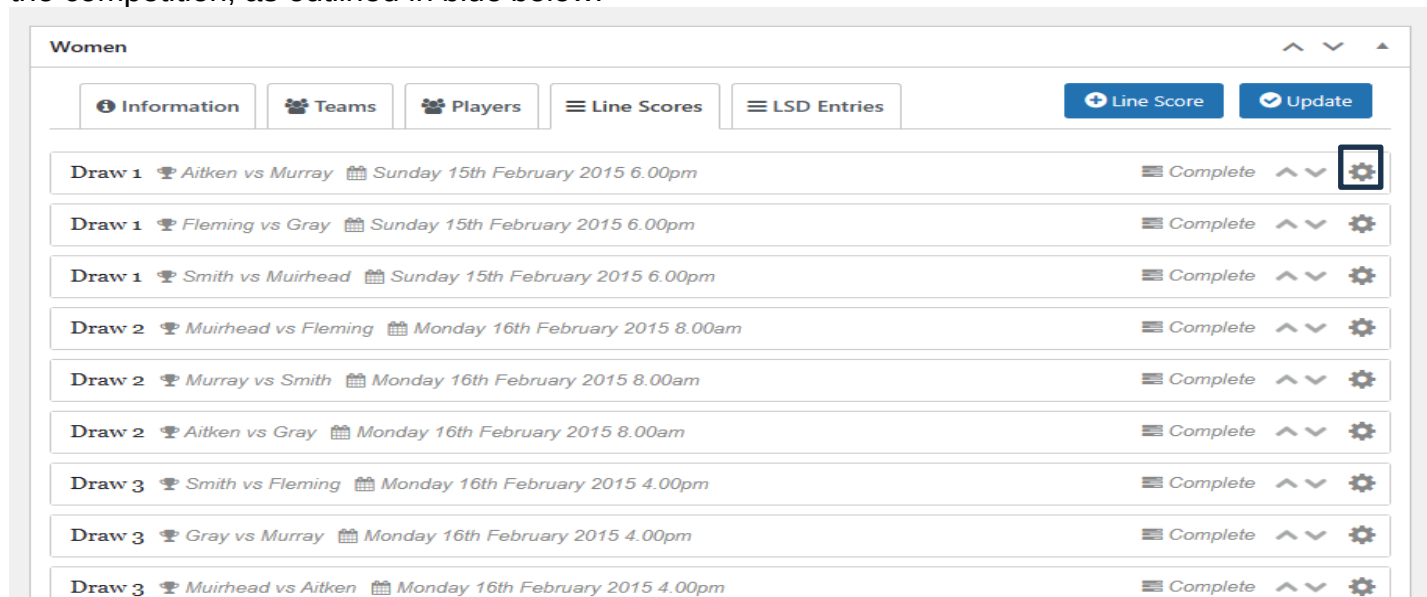


Having clicked on the competitions tab, you will see a list all of the competitions which you have access to for line scoring (as displayed above). To begin line scoring, click on the title of the competition you wish to edit.

You have now accessed the editing page of the competition.

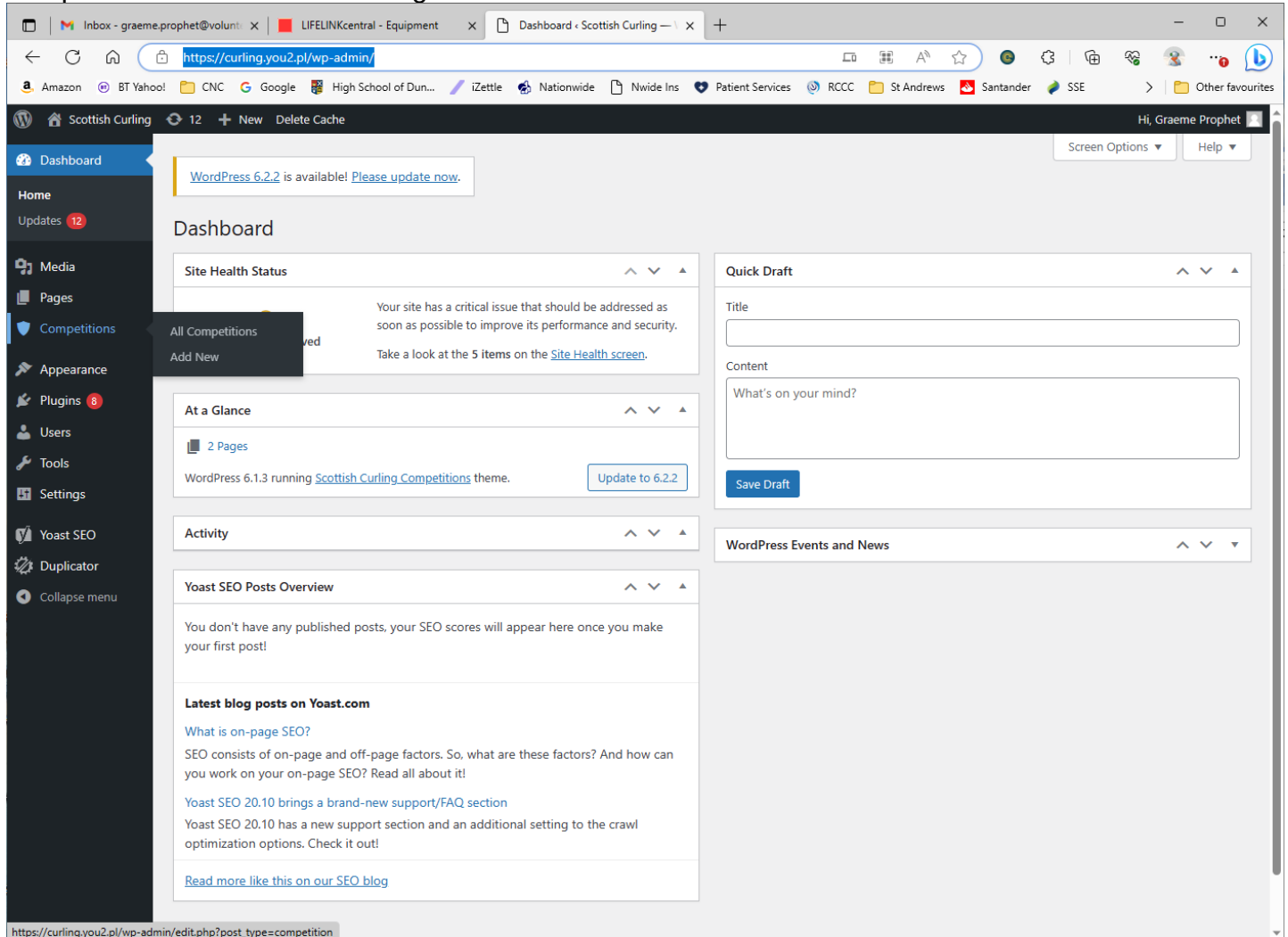
The line scoring page should already have been set up for you. You will be able to line score straight away.

You should be able to see the name of the sections i.e., Women's, Men's or Section A or B etc and the name of the game i.e., "Draw 1" and the teams which are playing in each game under the competition, as outlined in blue below.

If you do not find your competition, we can add our own competition. We would hover over competitions on the left hand edge and select Add New.

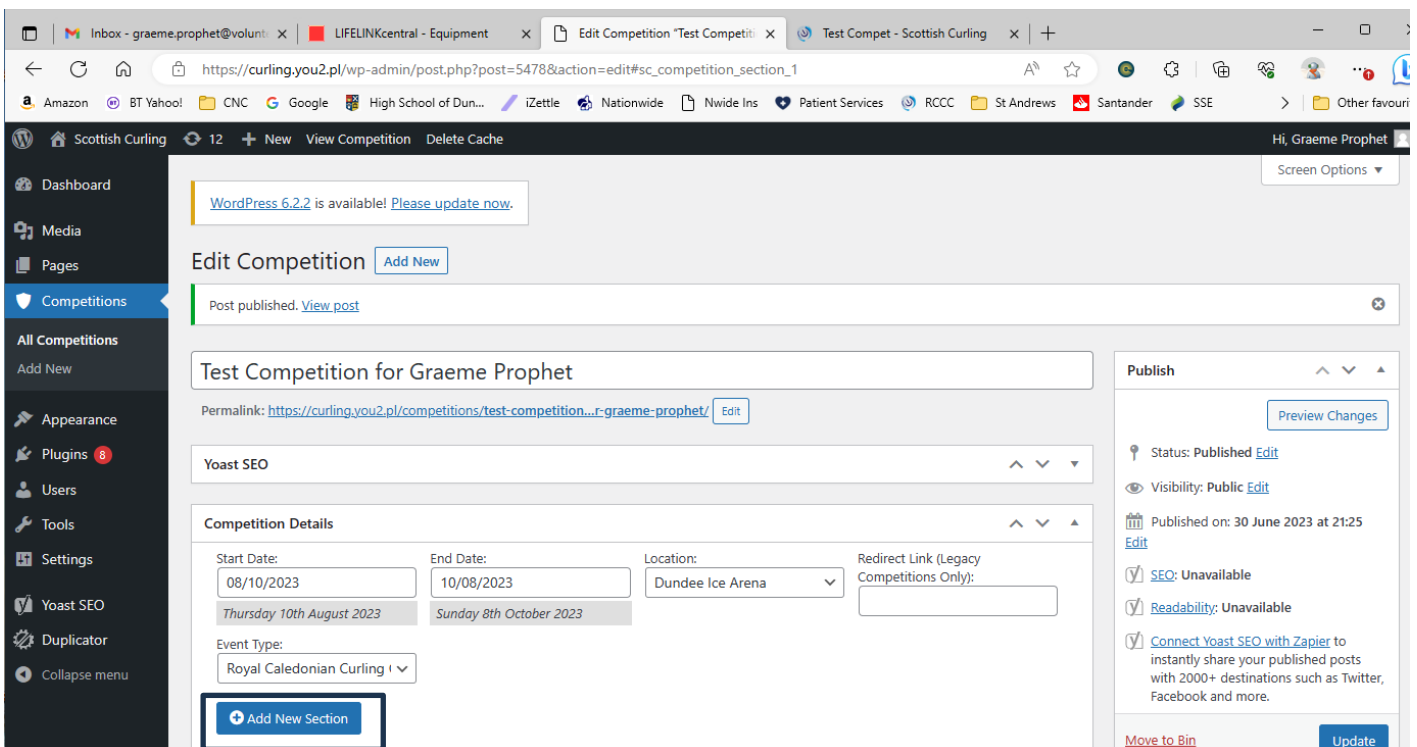

Here you will add the title of your competition. Once the title has been entered you will fill out the COMPETITION Details box. Enter the start in the American format i.e. mm/dd/yyyy. From the drop-down menus, select location and then event type. Once completed select the button ADD NEW SECTION

In the example I have set the date as 08/08/2023 to 08/10/2023 in DUNDEE ICE ARENA and it is a Scottish Curling Competition.

Section Title. Section A, Men, Women, Round Robin. This is the title of the section of the draw we are running.

Line Score Section

The format is Win/Loss. There are to be 2 qualifiers. At the moment we are not displaying the qualifiers, but when we do it will show Q1 and Q2.

Now we move on to the TEAM tab.

Enter each of the games in the section, normally named as Draw 1 then the players. So, in the competition there would have 4 linescores for draw 1, 4 for draw 2 and so on.

In the boxes along the top enter Draw1, the Date, the Time, and leave the game as scheduled. Then select the team playing from the drop-down boxes. Again, from the draw we have entered the first draw of the round robin.

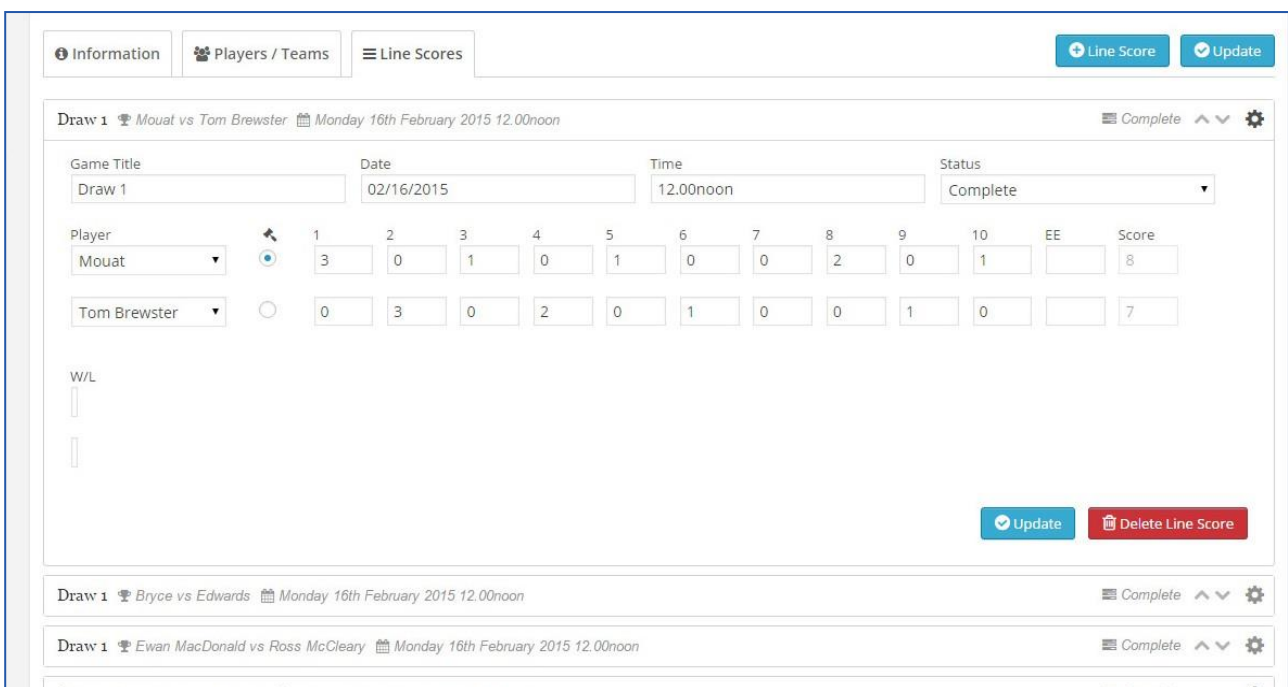

Hopefully prior to your competition all this section has been completed by Scottish Curling and we only have to check these things out at the start of the competition.

4. ENTERING LINE SCORES

Located at the top of the section is the “Information”, “Players/Team” and “Line Scores” tabs. The Information tab contains all the information such as the name of the section, the number of ends and the league format of the competition. The Players / Team tab allows you to enter all the competing teams in each section. The Line Scoring tab contains all the specific game information such as name of the draw, date and time of the competition, and the line scoring itself. This information has been entered for you in the early stages, but you will have to enter it for the Quarter-Finals, Final etc.

To begin line scoring, select the game you wish to enter a score for by clicking on the cog symbol in the top right-hand corner as highlighted in blue above.

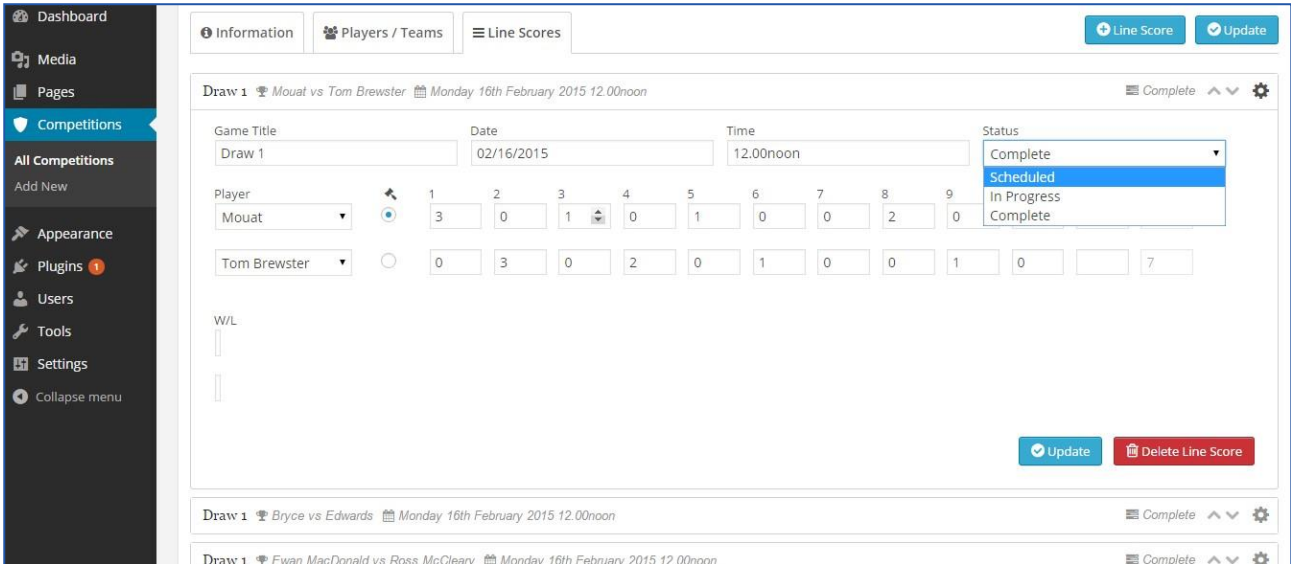

Before entering any line scores, ensure the team that has the hammer has been selected by clicking on the circle under the hammer symbol. All the other fields such as date and time have already been entered but please ensure that the correct teams are entered corresponding to the draw.

Click on the “status” drop-down menu and move the game status from “scheduled” i.e. due to happen, to “in progress” for when the game is active. The third options is “complete” for when the game is finished.

To enter line scores, input the number of points scored in each end in the scoring fields as illustrated below. For the team which has not scored during the end, **ensure that you enter a zero** in the corresponding box as this is crucial for the system to record line scores.

Depending on which browser you are using you may also have the option to enter your scores with up and down arrows which are located to the right of the scoring boxes.

Once you have entered scores press the update button as shown below. You can see how the line scores appear on the competitions website at any time by clicking on the “Preview Changes” button located in the top right of the page in the “Publish” Section. This will open a new tab showing the public view of the website. **Always edit the site on the original tab and do not open more than one editing page at any time**

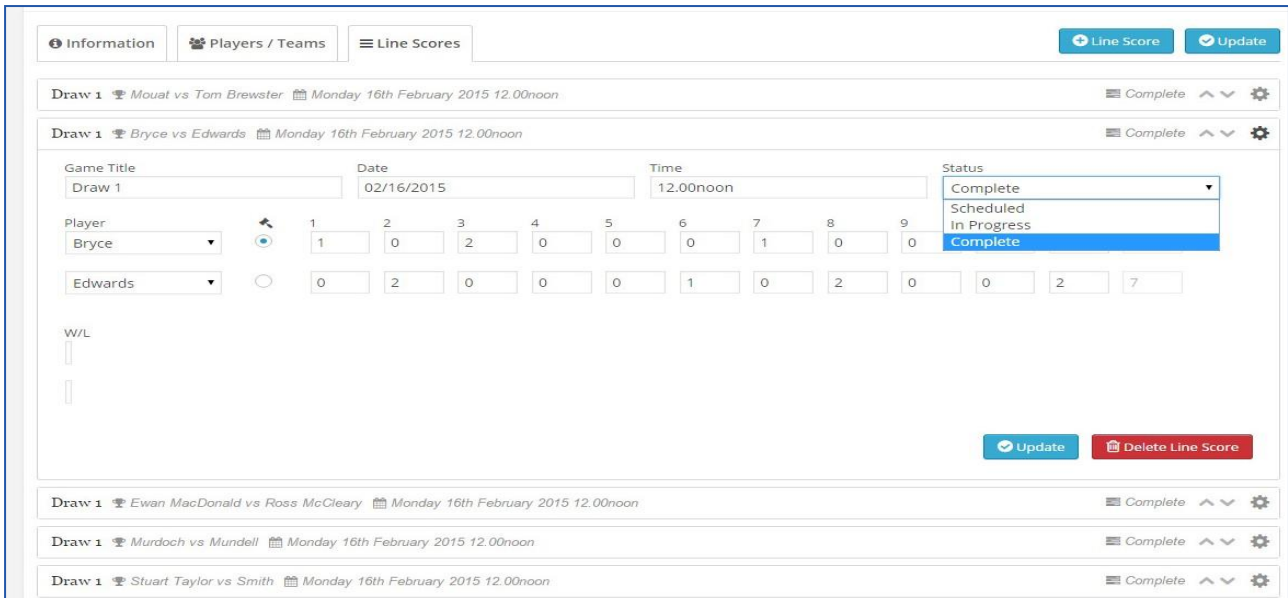

Note: you do not have to press the update button after every line score, you can enter scores from several games before pressing the update button. However, make sure that you are regularly hitting update to ensure all scores are up-to-date. **Scores will only appear on the website once the update button has been pressed. Please do not press update while site is updating or the page is refreshing as this can cause technical issues.**

5. CLOSING GAMES

Once you have entered all of the line scores and a game is completed, simply click on the status drop down once more and mark the game as “complete”. **Note:** when a game is marked as complete it will drop into the results and will be listed on the page under that section.

If all ends have not been completed, for instance if one of the teams' chooses to concede the game, mark the game as complete and the rest of the scores will be marked with X's to indicate that the game is complete and that the remaining ends were not played.

Once a game is marked as complete the points and/or wins and losses will be added automatically to the table on the Scottish Curling website to display standings.

In the event that a game is not played, for example if a team chose to forfeit a game before it is played or they run out of time, there is a win / loss option override. If this occurrence does take place, select win and loss from the drop-down menus as illustrated below. **Do not use this override in any other circumstances as this will not show the final score.**

Here the screen is pre-populated with the players and their teams that were entered earlier.

In these boxes against the individual players, their LSD measurements will be entered as they are completed either clockwise on the left or counter-clockwise on the right. As the scores are entered you will notice that the total change as each figure is entered. As the players reach their required number of LSD rotations their names will turn green as before.

Should a team or even all teams request a printout of their LSD's: In the LSD Tab click on the team's name and drag your mouse to the end of the LSD calculation as below. Team R Craik selected. Right click anywhere in the Blue Highlighted area and select PRINT. A print screen will then appear and select print.

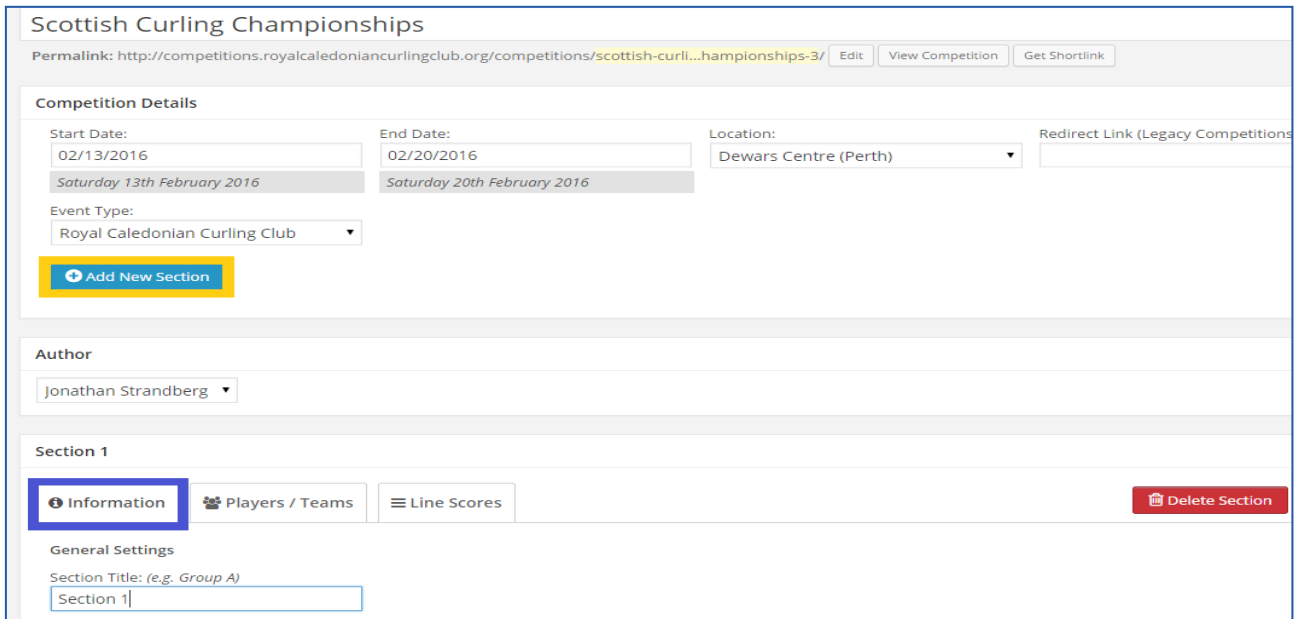

7. ADDING KNOCK-OUT STAGES

The section games will already have been pre-entered into the competition page prior to the start of the competition, however final stage games will have to be added.

To add final stage games first click on the “Add Section” button as shown above in yellow. This will open a new section below. Complete all of the information as mentioned in Section 3. Begin by filling in the “Information” tab starting with the Section title i.e. Quarter Final, Play-Off, High Road etc. In the “Line Score Settings” select from the drop-down menus whether there is the possibility of extra ends and the number of ends in the game as shown below. Ensure that you fill in this field, especially if scoring a junior competition as the system will default to 10 ends. In the “League Table Settings” select what form of League format the competition takes, whether it is a win/loss or a points format. If the competition takes a league format then highlight how many qualifiers there will be from each section. To display qualifiers in the table on the RCCC website select display qualifiers “Yes” and enter the number of qualifiers by entering a “Q” followed by the qualifying spots and a comma i.e. Q1, Q2 etc as shown in the highlighted section below.

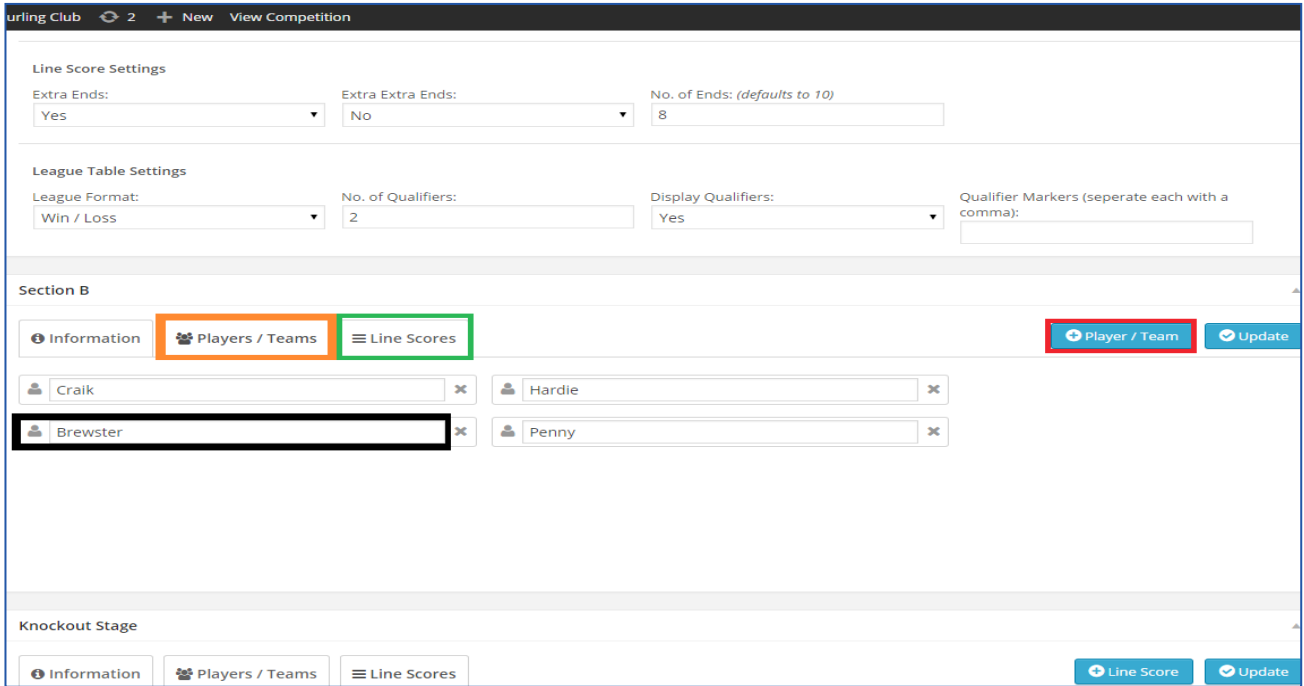

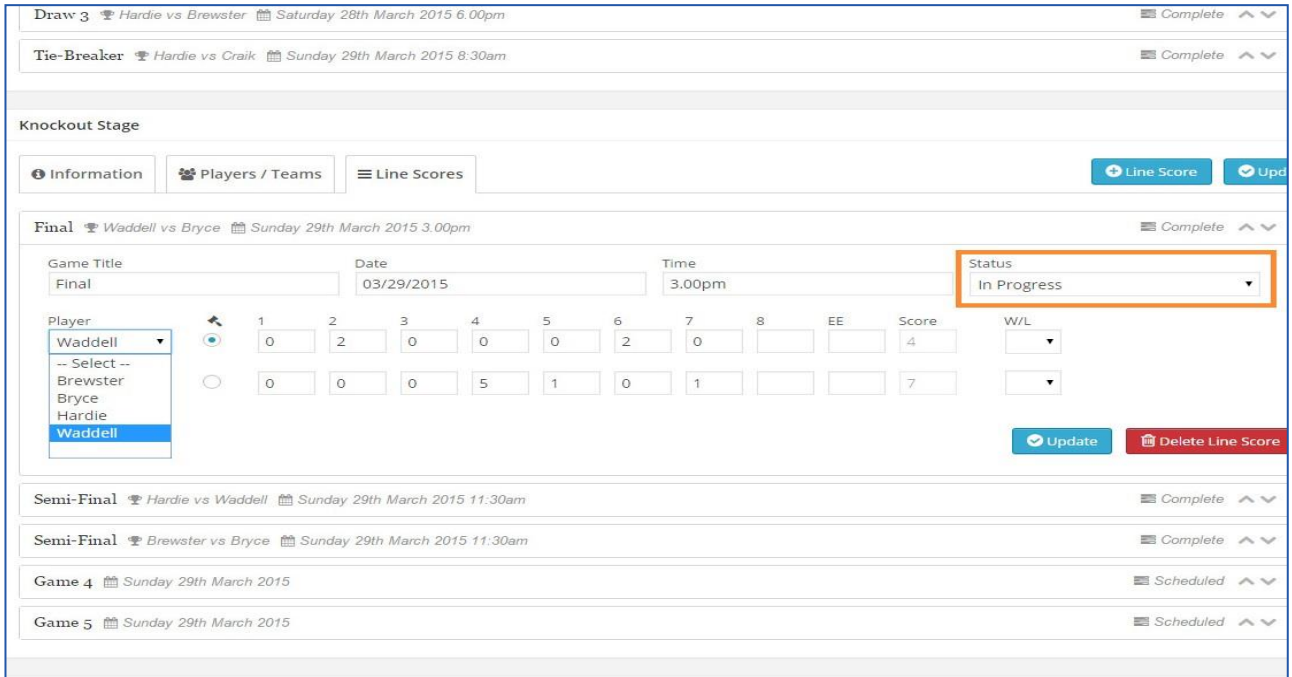
